



Year 7s at ASHS have their own areas to sit, relax, play and enjoy!






Finding my way around ASHS - Arts and Technology

ASHS is a very large school. Apart from the main buildings there are also two specialized blocks that cater for the Arts and Technology and Design. These sit alongside the school to the Western side and are where you will do all of your art, music, drama, woodwork, metalwork, cooking and textiles.

The Albany Performing Arts Centre will open in 2023 and will be an exciting new facility for our Performing Arts classes and will be used as our exam centre and assembly space.



Your classes

ASHS In-Class Expectations:

- 1. Be on time to class
- 2. Line up/wait patiently outside the classroom
- 3. Enter the room quietly and prepare to learn with the necessary equipment
- 4. Use an inside voice and appropriate language
- 5. Mobile phones are away and on silent

ASHS Out of Class Expectations:

- 1. Respect the environment and school equipment
- 2. Move around the school safely and sensibly
- 3. Keep our 'hands off" other students
- 4. Use appropriate language
- 5. Keep within in-bound areas

Form Classes

Your form class is put together based on information gained from various sources. Each form class will have students from different schools and contain students with a range of different needs. You might be lucky enough to have one of your close friends in your form class, otherwise it is a wonderful opportunity to meet other students and form different friendships!

* If in the Gifted and Talented class, you will remain together in a class for English, Maths, Science and HASS, and then be in amongst the rest of your peers for your other classes.

During Years 7 and 8 you are given the chance to engage in subjects from all Learning Areas. It's a wonderful opportunity to be exposed to a range of opportunities.

From Year 8 you will have the chance to choose which subjects you would like to study.

School Dress Code

Albany Senior High School and the School Board in consultation with students, their parents and staff of the school have formed our School Dress Code following the WA Department of Education's Dress Code for Students in Public Schools policy and procedures. Students are required to wear the correct school uniform at all times.

Sport uniform is worn only on days when you have Physical Education (PE) lessons. Students are required to change into their sport uniform before PE lessons and change back into school uniform at the end of the lesson.

Mobile Phones at ASHS

Mobile phones have the potential to disrupt the learning of students and we are unable to take responsibility for them if they are lost or stolen.

Mobile phones are turned to silent at 8.30 am and kept away. Phones are used only under the direction of teachers for educational purposes.

School routine and general procedures

Absent from school

Explanation from your parents is required if you are going to be absent from school. This can be done via Compass or phone (contact numbers can be found on the ASHS communication page in this booklet). If you are absent for a number of days due to being unwell, a medical certificate will need to be provided to the school.

Late to school

Students must present to Student Services to sign in and to be provided with a late note. Lateness to school is monitored by Program Coordinators. Students show their late note to their teacher when they arrive at class.

Signing out

If you need to leave the school grounds for any reason during the school day (eg an appointment) you sign out at Student Services. Ideally, you should do this first thing in the morning when you get to school. Students must provide a note from the parent/caregiver requesting permission to leave during the school day with a reason specified. If students are returning to school, they sign back in at Student Services before returning to class.

SmartRider Cards

SmartRider cards are used for various reasons at ASHS. They are required to loan books/equipment from the library, printing and catching the school bus.

Lockers

Lockers are available for students to use at ASHS. A small one-off deposit is charged for the use of a padlock and locker. On payment, students choose a locker and are issued with a padlock. The deposit will be fully refunded once the padlock is returned.

Canteen

ASHS has a well organised, healthy canteen. It offers a range of food and drink at reasonable prices. Students are able to purchase food at recess and lunchtimes. Lunches need to be ordered before school or at recess by presenting at the canteen or completing an online order (through our school website).

School routine and general procedures continued...

Year 7 Area

Each year group in the school has an allocated area where they can hang out before school and during recess and lunchtime. The Year 7 area has a vast area for students to hang out in and areas where ball sports and other activities can be conducted.

As with any area of the school there will be a number of staff members on duty at all times before school (after 8.30 am) and during recess and lunch. Older students are not permitted in the Year 7 area.

Your first day at ASHS!

The big day has arrived! Here is everything you need to know about what will happen on your first day at ASHS.

When you arrive at school head straight to the Year 7 area. Here you will be met by the Year 7 Student Support Officer and Program Coordinator.

The day starts with a whole of school assembly in the gymnasium. When the bell sounds the Student Support Officer will direct you to an area where your bags will be left (they will be supervised by staff members) and you will enter the gym to sit in a space with the rest of your Year 7 cohort.

At the end of the whole of school assembly, the Year 7 cohort will remain in the gym for a Year 7 assembly which will provide you with information about the rest of your day. Here you will be issued with your timetable and will be directed to leave with the teacher of your first official class of the day.

Instructions for the rest of your first day will be given during this class.

What do I need to bring on Day One?

You will not need to bring everything that you have purchased from the school booklist. Only the essentials will be required on the first day (listed below). Instructions will be given by class teachers regarding when textbooks are required and where they can be left so that you don't have to carry them around in your bags all day!

The Essentials!

- Pencil case containing pens, pencils, eraser, white-out etc.
- BYOD (or file with paper if you have not purchased a device).
- Recess, lunch (or money to purchase) and a water bottle.
