FROM THE PRINCIPAL

As the Centenary year for ASHS is rapidly drawing to a close, there is both much to celebrate and much to do in our final weeks. Thank you to all our parents and guardians for your support of the students and school over the past year, especially in the payment of contributions and charges. It has been another busy year with many highlights for staff and students. As we come to the end of the year, we sadly farewell our graduating class and some staff members. The highlights of the Awards night are celebrated further in the newsletter, with a list of our award winners. The class of 2018 are a credit to themselves, their families, and the school and we wish them well for the future.

Throughout the year we have celebrated many achievements, from turning 100 as a school, to recognising the many varied ways in which our students achieve academically, through leadership and in pursuit of interests and skills beyond school. Our recent Community Achievers afternoon tea highlighted to me that ASHS students achieve through grasping opportunities as they arise and not quitting when it gets tough. Congratulations to those students recognised at this time, in addition to Emma Pedretti, in recognition of her nomination for secondary teacher of the year.

At the end of each year, teachers are in the process of reflecting on what worked during the year, and how to improve for the following year, with much time already being invested in planning for 2019. Our senior school students, while they have left, will be going through a similar process as they reflect upon their performance this year, in anticipation of their goals and courses for the next year. Soon, parents and students of years 7-10 will also receive their reports, and I encourage a simple, yet similar approach for all students in these years. Our reports give a range of information about our students, and each child is different. Look at attendance, the learning behaviours and comments, in addition to the grades, to focus on what went well, and identify areas for growth next year. Then think about what might be needed to improve and identify the steps you would need to take to make that happen. Be realistic; break it down into achievable goals. The task for next year is to put your plan into action!

Reflections propel us forward, and 2019 will bring new opportunities for us to grasp and through which, to grow! The Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) initiative is being re-energised in 2019, with the specifications going to all students and the item being listed on booklists for each year group. The benefits of students having their own computer for use at school and home are numerous. Of all the benefits, I think student familiarity with their own device is significant. With increasing trends to use technology in our workplaces, it is obvious that we need to be equipping students with the skills to use technology skillfully and appropriately. 2019 will see our students conduct NAPLAN Online in addition to teaching and learning programs being enhanced through CONNECT, which provides 24/7 access to learning content. The school specifications are provided so that families buy a

device that will run on the school network and perform the tasks required of them, for as long as possible. It is an additional cost, but as I am reminded, they are often cheaper than the mobile phones many of us have. In time, the use of BYODs will lead to opportunities for us to be able to provide online text subscriptions and other learning experiences that might end up saving costs.

To all of our families, I would like to wish you all a safe and enjoyable holiday.

Delivering a Healthy WA

The 2019 WA School Based Immunisation Program will be offered at your school by the local community school health immunisation nurses.

These vaccinations are free to all Year 8 students and will be undertaken in Terms 1 and 4.

The schedule is as follows:

Gardasil 9 is the new HPV (human papilloma virus) vaccination and will be given in a 2-dose schedule in Terms 1 and 4.

Diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis vaccine (whooping cough) will be given in Term 1.

Vaccination consent forms will be sent home with students. Parents/legal guardians are asked to complete and sign the forms and return them to the school. Even if you are not consenting to your child receiving the vaccines, please return the form.

If you do not receive a vaccination consent form for your child, please ask at the school office for one. An information pamphlet is included in the envelope. Immunisation forms are to be returned to school as soon as possible for checking.

Any queries regarding the immunisation program please contact Sally Moir on 9842 7526.

If your child is not vaccinated at school, they can come to our immunisation clinic at the Albany Health Campus. No cost is involved. Phone 9892 2499 for an appointment.

The end of the school year sees the wind-up of all of our musical ensembles, farewelling Year 12 students, and celebrating our groups' achievements.




Year 9 Visual Arts Bird Caricatures
